

Icelandic Roots: Christmas at Árbær



Located in the Elliðaárdalur valley in what is now a suburb of Reykjavík, Árbær farm was a long-time common stopping point for travelers on their way to and from Reykjavík. As the city grew, residents in the area became concerned that the old ways of life would be lost. In 1957 Árbær Open Air Museum was founded to help maintain a tie to life in previous times. The museum currently contains some 20 buildings, including a traditional turf house that creates a village on the site. It is open year-round and celebrates special holidays....we will share Christmas on the site!




